From the Principal

It is really encouraging and enjoyable to see so many students trying their best, enjoying their efforts and supporting each other throughout the day!

I also wish to thank the staff and parents who helped make the Athletics carnival such a success! Especially, I thank Mr Nick Payne, Acting Head of Sport at the College for his thorough preparation and management of the day. Organising and conducting a day like this takes an enormous amount of skill and time and I wish to place on record my thanks to Mr Payne for his work in this regard!

Safety Issues

This week I have spoken with students about the very important issue of safety, particularly in the period immediately after school finishes. At any school, this is a busy time with students waiting for buses to arrive and parents or guardians to pick them up. As a result, the areas where students wait for their means of transport are often congested and this can lead to people becoming impatient and taking risks.

I take this opportunity to ask that all members of the College community use the footpaths to walk along the designated car parks. Taking short cuts across the parking bays themselves is far too risky and could lead to a tragic accident involving students, parents or staff. I would ask parents to lead the way in this regard by setting the correct example for their children and by reinforcing to them an expectation that they will always use the paths rather than walking or running across the parking bays.

I have also addressed student behaviour when they are waiting for buses to arrive. The areas in which students wait for buses are not designed for ball games or for chasing each other around. These types of activities inevitably lead to students getting injured, damage being done to uniforms and to College property and potentially to more serious incidents when students play spills over into car parking areas, the bus turning circle or onto the road!

In relation to the Albury campus, it has become apparent that a small number of parents are using the staff car parking area behind the Multi Purpose Hall to drop off and pick up their children. I would ask that parents and senior students respect that only staff and College vehicles should access this area.

The safety and well-being of students at Trinity is paramount. We cannot turn a blind eye to habits or behaviours which put this at risk and I have asked staff to monitor these areas very closely.

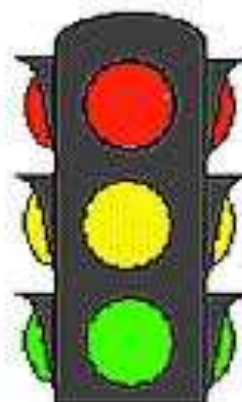
