Last call: International Trips

The College's international study tours are designed to broaden the mind and enrich the cultural and educational experiences of Trinity students.

Following the wonderful success of this year's inaugural study tour to Europe, I am pleased to announce that the College plans to offer the following international study trips:

- A French study trip to New Caledonia in June/July 2013 (please note that the College is aiming to undertake this trip during the semester break rather than the September break as previously advertised!)
- A study tour of Europe in the June/July break of 2014

The focus of the trip to New Caledonia is to provide students studying French as an elective study in Years 8, 9, 10 or 11 a chance to immerse themselves in a French speaking culture and setting. The College last sent students to Noumea in 2009 and knows that culturally and educationally such an experience is very beneficial for students wanting to extend their French skills. There will be two options for this wonderful trip and these are outlined below:

1. Hotel-stay option. 8 nights stay. \$ 2,692.00 approx.

This figure includes:

- air travel from Albury to Sydney to Nouméa and return
- transfers to and from the airport,
- accommodation in the hotel for **8** nights, shared room
- Half-day guided city tour of Noumea by coach.
- eight two-hour French lessons
- travel insurance.



2. Home-stay option. 14 nights stay. Two students with the family. \$3,933.00 approx.

This figure includes:

- air travel from Albury to Sydney to Nouméa and return,
- transfers to and from the airport,
- accommodation with a family for **14** nights, shared room, all meals
- Half-day guided city tour of Noumea by coach.
- eight two-hour French lessons
- travel insurance

Madame Bennett plans to take the students to Phare Amadée as part of the trip in 2013 – an island about an hour’s boat ride off Noumea, where the snorkelling is magic and they are taught how to tie pareos and climb coconut trees.

EUROPE 2014: The study tour to Europe will encompass rich experiences across a number of subject areas for students, including English, History and Visual Arts. Europe holds a vast array of opportunities to explore and therefore the College may look to vary the itinerary to take in a couple of new experiences and places for those involved. Certainly, the College would look to run a trip of 2.5 – 3 weeks and take in significant places of interest to maximise the cultural and educational opportunities for students. Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 in 2014 are those students who would be eligible for this proposed trip. The estimated cost of such a trip would be in the vicinity of \$5,500.

Of course, before the College gets ahead of itself with any commitments and planning, we need to determine if we have the numbers to make the trip viable. At least 10 students would be required for the trip to New Caledonia to go ahead and 20 students for the trip to Europe. Therefore I would ask that students and their parents discuss these opportunities and if they are interested in pursuing the idea, please do so by emailing an initial expression of interest to the following email addresses:

Expressions of interest can also be delivered to the front office of the Albury campus of the College and should be received by Monday, 19 November.

The Bishop's Social Justice Essay and Media Competition

The inaugural competition was launched this year with much of the effort coming from Fr Peter MacLeod-Miller and Clinton Monteiro, Youth Group leader at St Matthew's Albury. An extension of deadline being granted due to the amount of interest, the entries are finally in and are being sorted ready to pass on for the final judging. Entries have been received from around the Diocese of Wangaratta as well as from Brisbane and Melbourne. Interest came from a wide range of schools and religious affiliations and the organisers are delighted with the response.

The final judging panel will include Julian Burnside AO QC, a leading human rights activist, Rowan Callick, the south-east Asian correspondent for The Australian and Bishop John Parkes the Bishop of Wangaratta. Obviously the announcement of winners will depend a little on their schedule.

As someone who was involved on the outskirts I want to note how delighted I was with the involvement of the students of Trinity who rose to the challenge and presented a large number of entries. Several Year 10 groups put their media skills to good use and presented films as their entry. One in particular featured interviews with Ms Millan and Mr Fagan. Another re-enacted some of the experiences which refugees may go through as they try to settle in Australia. The student body as a whole displayed creativity and ingenuity in their presentations.

The discussion which arose in classrooms and homes as a result of the competition can only have been useful in developing our understanding of the nuances of this very challenging feature of 21st Century life, in which we are all involved by virtue of our status as citizens of the world.

Dear Parents

It has come to my attention that some Junior School students are not wearing the complete College Uniform to school. The College prides itself on the students being in correct uniform. The College sees the wearing of the correct uniform as a reflection of itself and therefore requires all students to be dressed appropriately. I would ask you to consider the uniform requirements listed below and should your son or daughter fall short in a particular area to arrange for it to be corrected.

Trinity Anglican College Uniform Requirements – Summer Terms

Girls' Summer Uniform

Girls may wear either the College dress or uniform navy shorts and white over blouse, both with the College logo. White socks with dual red stripes are worn with black lace-up leather black shoes. Summer uniform is worn in Terms 1 and 4. All students must wear a College hat when outside: this includes travelling to and from school on public transport for all students. Length of dress must be no more than 10cm above the knee and shouldn't be altered in any way.

Boys' Summer Uniform

Boys wear a white, short-sleeved, open-necked shirt with the College logo, grey long leg, tab-sided shorts and the College red striped, grey socks with black, leather lace-up shoes.

Uniform, Hair, Jewellery and Make-Up

Requirements for the wearing of uniform and the acceptable form of hairstyles are the same throughout the College. The appropriate College uniform must be worn well and with pride, and hair must be neat, not be too long for boys and held back in an acceptable manner for girls. Extreme styles are not acceptable. No jewellery is to be worn by boys.

For girls, the only jewellery that may be worn is one set of sleepers or stud earrings in the lowest hole in their ears; a small cross may be worn on a chain around the neck. Make-up is not allowed.

Assembly & Chapel

Due to the Senior School exams taking place in the Multi-Purpose Hall next week a shortened Junior School Assembly will be held on the field in front of the flag pole on Tuesday 20th November.

Presentations to the Year 3 – 6 students will occur at midday with the K-2 students receiving their awards from 12:25am.

This year's final Chapel Service will be held on Tuesday 27th November at midday and feature Kindergarten's depiction of the Nativity. This Service is a whole of Junior School occasion.

Science News

Last Wednesday, 7 November, Dylan Outtrim, Adele Trebilcock and myself were lucky enough to be able to attend the 2012 Mann lecture at LaTrobe university presented by Australia's chief scientist, Professor Ian Chubb.

Professor Chubb spoke at the lecture about Australia's science and its future and I quote "a world without science is a world we would not want to live in." He spoke in great detail of the *Health of Australian Science Report* and the achievements of Australia's scientific community. More closely related to us however, he talked of science in schools of all levels. From getting more science programs into primary schools, teaching science "as science is performed" in high schools to generate more interest, and of grants that they would like to bring into universities for studying sciences, at the moment especially agricultural sciences. He also stated that ALL science starts with the teacher and therefore they are planning to look towards more ways of supporting the science teachers in schools.

Before attending this lecture the three of us, and a selection of other students from across the border were invited to attend a "meet-and-greet" with Professor Chubb and some other professors from the local area where we were given an opportunity to discuss science in school over afternoon tea. This was a fabulous opportunity for all of us involved. From the entire evening one main quote has stuck with me, "it is important that we know something today that we did not know yesterday" and I can guarantee that all three of us did during this wonderful opportunity.

Dyslexia

What is it? The term is commonly heard.

Dyslexia is a learning difficulty that primarily affects the skills involved in accurate and fluent word reading and spelling.



The characteristic features are difficulties in:

1. Phonological awareness
2. Verbal memory
3. Verbal processing speed.

Recent research indicates that *“reading is primarily a linguistic skill, contrary to the once popular notion that it is primarily a visual skill.....”*

“ ... research strongly suggests that reading difficulties in most children are caused by deficits in phonological coding.”

“ Reading disability research has also established that reading difficulties are not caused by visual deficits...”

These excerpts are taken from a 30 page report *“Specific reading disability (dyslexia: what have we learned in the past four decades?”* by Vellutino, Fletcher, Snowling and Scanlon. 





Examination timetables are available via the College website. The table below outlines, in broad terms, when each exam will occur.


